

Łutsel K'e Community Programs Supported by Cheetah Resources

The upcoming Łutsel K'e Dene First Nation Annual General Assembly and the community's Funeral Fund have each received financial contributions from Cheetah Resources Corp.

The funds were presented Feb 1 to the Łutsel K'e Band Council during a community engagement visit by David Connelly, Vice President of Strategy and Corporate Affairs for Cheetah and its sister company, Vital Metals Ltd., and Eben Visser, Vital's Chief Operating Officer.

"We're glad to have Cheetah Resources visit our community and assist community programs," said Łutsel K'e Chief James Marlowe. "This is a sign of reaching a good working relationship that will provide outstanding benefits to LKDFN members."

Cheetah Resources is mining Canada's first rare earth deposit at its Nechalacho Demonstration Project approximately 100 kilometres west of Łutsel K'e.

"The visit to Łutsel K'e was one of a number we're undertaking to share our plans with stakeholders and learn from their traditional knowledge," said Connelly. "Community engagement is an important ongoing activity." Meetings with several other First Nations and Metis, and neighbouring communities, have been or will be held in the near future.
